

Children are drawn towards ships as if by magic. But bigger people are also fascinated by them.


Ships are the oldest form of transport in the world. New continents were discovered with their help. They convey huge loads and countless passengers thousands of nautical miles.


















































































































The Cutter is a ship that can really "sail". A counterweight, which corresponds in technical terms to the keel of a boat, allows the boat to make a rocking movement as if it were floating on the water. The movement is gentle and can be initiated even by small children walking up and down. Together with the cabin, the helm and other elements, this movement game creates a special play atmosphere where little sailors can use all their senses to experience the charm of a ship.































Younger children in particular will enjoy taking part in movement and role-playing games on our small ships and boats. With the Sailing Boat, Catamaran, Swaying Ship or small Sand Play Ship, even landlubbers can embark on a great voyage.

The Sailing Boat and Catamaran will have young explorers bobbing happily on the waves, especially if someone is at the mast to make sure there is a strong breeze.

The small Sand Play Ship is both a sandbox and a sailboat. Very young children can take on the role of pirate, sailor or captain, and at the same time play in the sand of the ship's hull.

The Swaying Ship is also an attraction for the little ones. The first to discover the ship can claim one of the two seats. But they won't really get going until the opposite seat is taken. Then they must concentrate all their efforts on creating a rocking motion. The resilience of the large tyre allows for a gentle sway in all directions.
